GENERAL MINOR IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Any Indiana University students enrolled in a baccalaureate program, **except those pursuing a major in criminal justice**, may pursue the minor in criminal justice. Students who successfully complete the requirements will have the minor conferred with their degree.

Students must declare their intentions to receive a minor by completing an **application**, which is available in **SPEA Student Services, BS 3025**. A **minimum GPA of 2.3** is required in courses taken specifically for the minor. At least **9 of the 18 credit hours** must be taken on the IUPUI campus.
